Message from the President



2009 was an exciting year for Sudbury Rainbow Crime Stoppers. We celebrated 22 years as a Program during which tips from citizens have assisted in solving over 22,000 cases and recovering almost \$44 million in stolen property and drugs.

In addition to holding our annual Tri-Force Regimental Ball and "Tee of for Tips" Golf Tournament, Sudbury Rainbow Crime Stoppers also held an "All Paws on Crime" Dog Walk, "Jail Break" in Gore Bay and "Race Against Crime" night at the races at Sudbury Downs.

Booths were set up at malls, businesses and schools in Sudbury and Elliot Lake as well as at events such as the Sportsman Show, Manitoulin Trade Fair, Gore Bay Summer Festival, 50 Plus Seminar in Espanola, Wellness Fairs and Valley East Days. The booths were manned by board members, police coordinators and volunteers who informed people about the Program, how it works and why it is so successful. Presentations on what Crime Stoppers is and how we can help were given to students and seniors in Espanola, M'Chigeeng, Sagamok Township, Elliot Lake, Noelville and Sudbury.

Sudbury Rainbow Crime Stoppers also brought Rick Osborne to speak to students at Sudbury Secondary and École secondaire du la Rivière-des-Français in Noelville. Rick shares his knowledge of addiction and street level crime as it relates to the drug, gang and violence issues that currently plague our communities.
