In order to maintain the honesty and integrity of horse racing, the Ontario Racing Commission (ORC) has entered into a partnership with Crime Stoppers in Ontario.

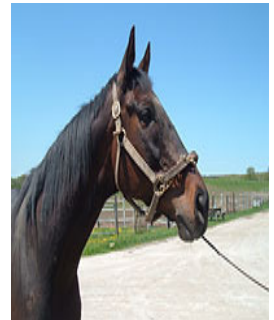

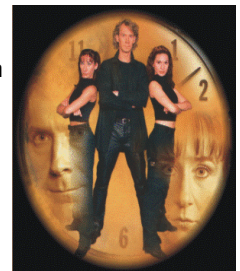
