“Ozzy’s Garage”



In July the Greater Sudbury Police Service brought a new initiative to Sudbury to help address youth crime, drug abuse and the threat of illegal street gangs establishing a footprint within our community. Through Astwood Strategy Corporation’s “Ozzy’s Garage” program local at-risk youth were brought together to work alongside master mechanic, mentor and former gang member, drug addict and prison veteran Rick “Ozzy” Osborne. Through this program, Ozzy has the opportunity to engage the youth in “small C” counseling around the issues they are facing in their lives, and provide “reality-based” advice. The “Ozzy’s Garage” program is founded on the two premises that redemption is possible and that high risk and gang-involved youth can be reached and worked with better through a non-traditional, fun and highly skilled trades program than through a typical intervention.

A small group of local at-risk youth were brought together to work with Rick Osborne on a Titan motorcycle while hearing about his experiences and the lessons he has learned.

To assist in the delivery of this program the Greater Sudbury Police Service partnered with numerous organizations and businesses including Sudbury Rainbow Crime Stoppers to ensure that all of the needs of the youth were met while maximizing on their opportunity to learn from Rick Osborne about the realities of a life of crime, drug abuse and gang involvement.

There is now a program in place to give Ontario's horse racing community an anonymous way to report any illegal activity relating to horse racing.

Halloween Safety Tips

Tips for Motorists

- * Avoid driving in subdivisions during the hours of 6 - 9 p.m. when most trick-or-treating takes place
- * Stay well below the speed limit and give yourself extra time to get to your destination
- * Pay extra attention to what is going on around you & watch for any children darting across the street or between parked cars
- * Walk around your vehicle before backing out of your driveway
- * Stay alert and aware of your surroundings when pulling in or out of driveways

Tips for Homeowners

- * Make sure your yard is clear of ladders, hoses, dog leashes and flower pots that can trip kids
- * Keep your pets in a secure place for the night
- * Artificial lights & candles are a safer alternative to real candles with a flame that can pose a fire hazard
- * If you do use candles, place the pumpkin well away from where trick-or-treaters will be walking or standing
- * Provide treats that are individually wrapped or offer non-food treats such as stickers, pencils and erasers

Tips for Parents & Kids

- * Always accompany your young child. Older children should go out as a group
- * Plan your route and make sure your family knows what it is
- * Always check your children's candy before they eat any
- * Accept treats only in the doorway. DO NOT go inside
- * Only visit houses where the lights are on
- * Have children carry a glow light or flashlight
