## Community Icon Destroyed by Fire

Shortly after 2:00 a.m. on Friday, September 19th, 2008 Greater Sudbury Fire Services responded to a fire at the Steelworkers Hall located at 92 Froot Road.

The fire burned for 26 hours and as a result the building suffered extensive structural damage and must be torn down. Files and documents for both Local 6500 and Local 2020 were lost along with 61 years of community memories. This building touched everyone in the community in some way over the years.

Investigators from the Ontario Fire Marshall's Office, Greater Sudbury Police Service and Greater Sudbury Fire Services have classified the fire as "Suspicious in origin" at this time.

With the assistance of donations from United Steelworkers International, United Steelworkers Local 6500 and United Steelworkers of Sault Ste. Marie, Crime Stoppers was able to offer a **guaranteed** reward of \$15,000 for any tips that were received between Monday, September 29th, 2008 and noon on Monday, October 6th, 2008 that resulted in an arrest.
